
Recruiting for your workforce just got easier. Join us on HANDSHAKE!

If you are not a current user on Handshake, register at app.joinhandshake.com/employer_registrations/new and follow these steps:

- Select the "Employer" account from the options
- Sign up with your company-issued email address and create a password.
- Request to join your existing company profile or create a new one.
- Validate your employer account if creating a new company profile.
- Users who are joining an existing company profile will either automatically connect with their company's profile or wait to be approved by the owner of their company's Handshake profile.
- To connect with New Mexico State University (NMSU):
 - Employers must post a job and receive job approval or contact NMSU Office of Experiential Learning and ask to be approved if you do not have a job to post.

Once your account has been approved, you will be able to:

- Create job postings
- Register for an upcoming career fair
- Request career events on-campus or virtually
- Request on-campus interviews

CORPORATE RELATIONS AND CAREER EVENTS (CRCE) SERVICES

orporate Relations and Career Events (CRCE) offers several options for employers seeking to fill their cooperative education/internship, part-time and full-time employment positions. Employers may post jobs, conduct on-campus interviews, host information tables, lunch-and-learns and coffee chats, conduct classroom presentations, employer panels, workshops, host mock interviews or resume reviews, and participate in career fairs. In addition, employers are welcome to partner with CRCE through the Aggie Corporate Sponsorship Packages. Below are descriptions of services available to employers.

Handshake

CRCE utilizes the Handshake Career Application, which allows employers to access and manage their recruiting activities from one centralized source. Employers can post jobs, schedule on-campus interviews, request on-campus and virtual events, register for career fairs and much more.

Job Postings

By utilizing our Handshake Career App system, you can post all forms of employment quickly and reach students from associate degree to doctoral candidates here at the NMSU Las Cruces campus as well as three community colleges. Handshake automatically generates email reminders when students apply for a job or when a posting is due to expire.

Recruiting

Employers are invited to participate in recruitment activities such as on-campus interviews, classroom presentations/informational sessions, tabling, meet-and-greets, mock interviews, resume reviews and coffee chats. 


COOPERATIVE EDUCATION AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAM


